Walking into Young Cardinal Cafe & Co. feels like stepping into a warm hug. I stopped by last Sunday with a couple of friends after hearing it was named North Carolina's top brunch spot by Yelp. The place was buzzing, but we snagged a table on their cute outdoor patio. The menu is all about classic breakfast with a modern spin, and I couldn't resist their hot honey chicken. The chicken was crispy, drizzled with just the right amount of sweet-spicy

honey, and paired with a fluffy waffle that soaked up all the flavors. My friends went for the create-your-own hash bowl, piling it with fresh veggies and perfectly runny eggs. The coffee was a standout—locally roasted and so smooth I didn't need sugar. Our server, Jamie, was a gem, checking in just enough to keep things flowing without hovering. The vibe is laid-back but lively, with local art on the walls and sunlight streaming in. I also loved how customizable everything was, from grits bowls to benedicts. It's no wonder this place has a near-perfect rating. If you're in downtown Winston-Salem, this is the spot to kick off your day. Just get there early—it fills up fast!

Mozelle's is my go-to when I want a brunch that feels special without being stuffy. I took my wife here for her birthday, and it was a home run. The Southern-inspired menu had us both drooling, but I went for the shrimp and grits, which were creamy, rich, and packed with flavor from locally sourced shrimp. My wife's eggs Benedict with house-made hollandaise was so good she didn't share a single bite. The open-air patio was perfect for a sunny Sunday, with a breeze keeping things cool and string lights adding a cozy touch. The staff were on point—our server, Lisa, recommended a peach mimosa that was dangerously refreshing. What I love about Mozelle's is how they nail the balance of upscale and welcoming. The ingredients are fresh, and you can tell they care about supporting local farmers. The tomato pie appetizer we shared was a surprise hit, bursting with summer flavors. The place has a lively buzz, but it's still easy to have a conversation. With over 600 glowing reviews, it's clear I'm not the only one who thinks this spot is a gem. If you're looking for a brunch that's a little fancy but still feels like home, Mozelle's is it.

Another Broken Egg Cafe is where I head when I'm craving something indulgent. I stopped by with my sister during a shopping trip at Thruway Center, and we were blown away. The menu is massive, with everything from pancakes to crab cake Benedicts. I went for the cinnamon roll French toast, and it was pure decadence—thick, sweet, and topped with whipped cream that melted in my mouth. My sister's shrimp 'n grits had a spicy kick that she raved about for days. The mimosas were a steal, and we couldn't resist trying the spiked cold brew, which was strong and smooth. The place has a bright, cheerful vibe with colorful decor and a staff that keeps things moving. Our server, Marcus, was super friendly and

didn't bat an eye when we asked for extra syrup. With over 800 reviews, it's clear this spot is a local favorite, and I get why. They use fresh ingredients, and the portions are generous enough to justify the price. The only downside? It can get crowded on weekends, so I'd suggest arriving before 10 AM. If you're after a brunch that's fun, flavorful, and leaves you full, this is your spot.

The Katharine Brasserie & Bar is where you go when you want to feel a little fancy. I took my parents here for a Sunday brunch, and it was a treat from start to finish. Housed in the historic Kimpton Cardinal Hotel, the place has this elegant, old-world charm with high ceilings and plush booths. The menu blends French and Southern flavors, and I couldn't resist the croque monsieur—crispy, cheesy, and served with a side of fries that were perfectly golden. My mom's quiche florentine was light and packed with fresh spinach, while Dad swore his shrimp and gnocchi was the best he'd ever had. The cocktail list is impressive; their Bloody Mary had just the right amount of spice. Our server, Claire, was attentive and made us feel like VIPs. The vibe is sophisticated but not snooty, and the 500+ reviews back up its reputation. I loved how they source local ingredients, and the raw bar options looked tempting for next time. It's pricier, but the quality and ambiance make it worth it for a special occasion. If you're in downtown Winston-Salem and want a brunch that feels like an event, The Katharine delivers.

Sir Winston is a brunch spot that feels like a love letter to Winston-Salem's history. I went with my book club last weekend, and we were all impressed. The restaurant, a nod to the original Sir Winston from the 1960s, has a farm-to-table vibe with a European twist. I ordered the smoked salmon Benedict, and the eggs were poached to perfection, with a hollandaise that was rich but not heavy. My friends raved about the French toast, which came with local berries and a dusting of powdered sugar. The decor is classy yet relaxed, with exposed brick and big windows that let in tons of light. Our server, Ethan, was a pro, keeping our coffee cups full and recommending a lavender mimosa that was a total game-changer. With 400+ reviews averaging 4.5 stars, it's no surprise this place is a hit. They source ingredients locally, which you can taste in every bite, and the menu has options for everyone, from vegetarians to meat lovers. The only thing to watch is parking—downtown can be tricky on

weekends. For a brunch that's equal parts elegant and approachable, Sir Winston is a must-visit.

6th and Vine is my happy place for brunch in Winston-Salem's Arts District. I popped in with my girlfriend on a sunny Saturday, and the patio was calling our name. The menu is eclectic, with a mix of Southern and global flavors. I went for the crab and tomato omelet, which was fluffy and bursting with fresh ingredients. My girlfriend's biscuits with creamed spinach gravy were a revelation—comfort food with a gourmet twist. We shared a mimosa flight, and the passion fruit one was our favorite. The vibe is artsy and relaxed, with colorful murals and a wine bar that's tempting even at 11 AM. Our server, Rachel, was super chill and gave us great recs for dessert (the cheesecake was divine). Famous Toastery is where I take out-of-town guests to show off Winston-Salem's brunch game. I brought my cousins here during a family reunion, and it was a hit. The place is bright and bustling, with a menu that's got something for everyone. I ordered the banana crunch pancakes, and they were fluffy, sweet, and topped with crunchy granola that added the perfect texture. My cousins went for the mimosa flapjacks and a southwest wrap, both of which got two thumbs up. The coffee is locally roasted, and they keep your cup full without you asking. Our server, Tyler, was a riot, cracking jokes and making sure we had everything we needed. With 700+ reviews, it's clear this place is doing something right. Midtown Cafe & Dessertery is like the neighborhood diner you wish you had growing up. I stopped by with my kids on a Saturday morning, and it was the perfect spot for a family brunch. The menu is stacked with classics, and I went for the sweet potato pancakes, which were fluffy and had just the right hint of cinnamon. The kids loved their Belgian waffles, which came with whipped cream and fresh strawberries. The outdoor seating was a bonus—spacious and shaded, perfect for a warm day. Our server, Amanda, was a sweetheart, bringing extra napkins for my messy eaters without us asking. The place has a cozy, retro vibe, and with 650+ reviews, it's a local staple. The Porch Kitchen & Cantina is my pick for a brunch with a Southwestern kick. I went with my coworkers for a team outing, and we had a blast. The patio is huge and perfect for groups, with string lights and a laid-back vibe. I ordered the breakfast tacos, which were loaded with scrambled eggs, bacon, and a smoky queso that tied it all together. My coworkers raved about the breakfast of champions—tater tots smothered in guac, sour cream, and jalapeños. The margarita was a must, and their classic porch mimosa was crisp and refreshing. Our server, Carlos, kept the energy high and made sure our drinks never ran dry. With 500+ reviews, this place is a crowd-pleaser, and the Southwestern flavors set it apart from typical brunch spots. River Birch Lodge feels like a mountain getaway right in Winston-Salem. I took my girlfriend here for a Sunday brunch date, and we were both charmed. The “mountain casual” vibe is spot-on, with wooden beams and a cozy fireplace. I went for the eggs Benedict, which came with a creamy hollandaise and perfectly poached eggs. My girlfriend’s veggie frittata was loaded with fresh zucchini and peppers, and she loved how light it felt. We split a Bloody Mary, which had a nice kick and came with a skewer of pickles. The patio is gorgeous, surrounded by trees, and our server, Megan, made us feel right at home. With 600+ reviews, this place has a strong following, and it’s easy to see why. They offer gluten-free options, which is a plus, and the ingredients are top-notch. The full bar means you’ve got plenty of drink choices, from mimosas to craft beers. It’s a bit pricier, but the ambiance and quality make it worth it. If you’re looking for a brunch that’s relaxing and a little upscale, River Birch Lodge is a fantastic choice.
