Walking into Pondfield Cafe feels like stepping into a warm hug. I stopped by last Sunday with a couple of friends after a morning hike, and this place instantly won us over with its old-school diner vibe and friendly staff. The menu is packed with all the brunch classics you'd expect, but they nail the execution. I went for the power green omelet with egg whites, kale, and spinach, and it was fresh, fluffy, and perfectly seasoned. My friends raved about the pancake special—two eggs, two pancakes, bacon, and sausage that hit all the right spots. The coffee kept flowing, and our server, Maria, was a gem, checking in just enough to make us feel cared for without hovering. The cozy breakfast bar seating was perfect for soaking in the lively atmosphere, and the portions were generous without being overwhelming. It's the kind of place where you can linger over a mimosa and feel right at home. Pondfield Cafe's charm lies in its simplicity—nothing pretentious, just damn good food done right. Rory Dolan’s is my go-to when I’m craving a brunch with a side of Irish charm. I brought my family here for a lazy Sunday morning, and we were blown away by the warm, pub-like atmosphere. The Irish flags and woodwork set the scene, but the food stole the show. I ordered the full Irish breakfast—sausage, Irish bacon, black and white pudding, eggs, grilled tomato, beans, toast, and home fries. It’s a plate that means business, and every bite was hearty and flavorful. My wife went for the corned beef hash, which she said was the best she’s had in years. The kids loved the stack of pancakes, fluffy and served with a side of real maple syrup. Our server, Kris, was a rockstar, recommending drinks and keeping our coffee mugs full. The bottomless mimosas for \$25 on Sundays? Total game-changer. The place was buzzing with families and friends, but we never felt rushed. Rory Dolan’s nails that balance of festive and cozy, making it perfect for a big group or a chill meal. The only downside is parking can be tricky on weekends, but it’s worth the short walk. Yonkers Brewing Co. turned my usual brunch into something special. I met some old college friends here on a Saturday, and the industrial-chic vibe with exposed brick and long tables set the perfect mood for catching up. Their 90-minute bottomless brunch deal is a steal—mimosas, bloody Marys, and craft beers kept us in high spirits. I went for the smoked salmon Benedict, and it was a masterpiece: perfectly poached eggs, creamy hollandaise, and a generous portion of salmon on a toasted English muffin. My friends loved the steak and eggs, cooked just right with crispy home fries. The menu has something for everyone, from pancakes to omelets, and the portions are spot-on. Our server, Jake, was super attentive and even suggested pairing our meals with their house IPA, which was a crisp, refreshing touch. La Bella Havana is a brunch spot that feels like a mini-vacation to Cuba. I took my girlfriend here for a Sunday date, and we were hooked from the moment we walked in. The colorful decor and Latin music created such a fun, laid-back vibe. Their Sunday brunch special is a steal at \$9.95, including a free mimosa, and we splurged on the \$10 all-you-can-drink mimosas—totally worth it. I had the Cuban eggs Benedict with pulled pork and a zesty hollandaise that was out of this world. Eileens Country Kitchen is like brunch at your grandma's house, but with a Yonkers twist. I went with my best friend for a low-key Saturday morning, and we left feeling like we'd found our new favorite spot. The place has a homey, diner feel with

checkered tablecloths and a menu that covers all the bases. I got the corned beef hash with poached eggs, and it was savory, hearty, and perfectly balanced.
