The Basics, tucked in the historic Cotton Exchange, is a Wilmington staple that never disappoints. My wife and I stopped by for a lazy Sunday brunch after a morning walk downtown. The cozy, Southern-inspired atmosphere instantly put us at ease, with wooden accents and friendly staff who greeted us like regulars. I went for the shrimp and grits, a dish they absolutely nail—creamy polenta, plump shrimp, and a smoky chorizo gravy that had me scraping the bowl. My wife's French toast was a hit, stacked high with fresh berries and a drizzle of maple syrup that wasn't overly sweet. The coffee was locally roasted, rich, and kept coming, which was perfect for our slow morning. What stood out was the attention to local ingredients; you can taste the freshness in every bite. Vicious Biscuit is a biscuit lover's paradise. I stopped by with my brother during a weekend trip, and we were blown away by the sheer size of their fluffy, buttery biscuits. The place has a modern, casual vibe with a line out the door, but it moves fast. I ordered the Vicious Beignets—crispy fried chicken on yeast beignets dusted with powdered sugar and topped with whiskey cream sauce. It was indulgent, delicious, and unlike anything I've had before. My brother got The Gravy Train, a biscuit smothered in sausage gravy with a perfectly fried egg. We shared a side of bacon jam, which was smoky and sweet, and I'm still dreaming about it. The staff was upbeat, and our server checked in just enough to keep things flowing. The coffee was bold, and they even have fun merch like T-shirts that we couldn't resist grabbing.
